# Children's Services Council of Martin County Releases Invitation to Negotiate Black Infant Birth and Health Equity

In the summer of 2016, as part of the Florida Healthy Babies initiative, an Infant Mortality Analysis of Martin County was conducted. Key findings from the Martin County Healthy Babies Analysis include:

- The cause-specific Infant Mortality Rates (IMR) for Black infants were significantly higher than White infants and Hispanic infants.
- Black women had a higher rate of obesity at pregnancy than White or Hispanic women.
- Black women had a rate of 62.3% for breastfeeding initiation compared to that of White women at 82.3%.
- The Black infants had more than double the percentage of low birth weight than White and Hispanic infants.

Children's Services Council of Martin County (CSCMC) has issued an Invitation to Negotiate (ITN) to identify qualified community service providers for Martin County's children and families capable of implementing a community-based Black Infant Birth and Health Equity program.

Program services will reach Martin County neighborhoods with the greatest disparities in black infant birth and health outcomes.

## **Legislative Update**



Executives from the Children's Services Councils met with Representative Gayle Harrell in Tallahassee to discuss her recommendation to increase the number of Children's Services Councils in the state. Representative Harrell is the legislative representative on the Children's Cabinet. The Executive Directors updated her on what we are doing to accomplish that as a number of counties are planning to put it on the ballot in 2018.

Representative Harrell also voiced her support for the 1st 1000 Days efforts across the state. Other topics that were discussed were the emerging issues having to do with disparities in birth outcomes for black infants across the state/nation.

Another hot issue being discussed was the need to provide better access re: oral health care needs for young children. The Surgeon General, Celeste Philips spoke in support of future funding for the Dental Sealant Program statewide and Director of AHCA talked about more pediatric dentists and increased access to care.
